Thee's and Thou's

T - one person or one group - Thee, thou, thine, thou

Y - 2 or more - Ye, you, your

This distinction is completely lost in the modern translations. Let me show you how this will enrich your Bible study.

1. KJV - Luke 22:31 And the Lord said, Simon, Simon, behold, Satan hath desired *to have* <u>you</u>, that he may sift <u>you</u> as wheat: 32 But I have prayed for <u>thee</u>, that <u>thy</u> faith fail not: and when thou art converted, strengthen <u>thy</u> brethren.

Satan desired to sift all of the disciples but Jesus prayed for Peter.

ESV - Luke 22:31 "Simon, Simon, behold, Satan demanded to have <u>you</u>, that he might sift <u>you</u> like wheat,

32 but I have prayed for <u>you</u> that <u>your</u> faith may not fail. And when <u>you</u> have turned again, strengthen <u>your</u> brothers."

2. KJV - John 3:7 Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again.

The message was spoken to the individual Nicodemus (Thee) but Ye applies to all.

ESV – John 3:7 Do not marvel that I said to <u>you</u>, '<u>You</u> must be born again.'

3. KJV - Matthew 26:64 Jesus saith unto him, <u>Thou</u> hast said: nevertheless I say unto you, Hereafter shall <u>ye</u> see the Son of man sitting on the right hand of power, and coming in the clouds of heaven.

Thou refers to the high priest but you/ye includes all of those with the high priest

ESV – Matthew 26:64 Jesus said to him, "You have said so. But I tell you, from now on you will see the Son of Man seated at the right hand of Power and coming on the clouds of heaven."
